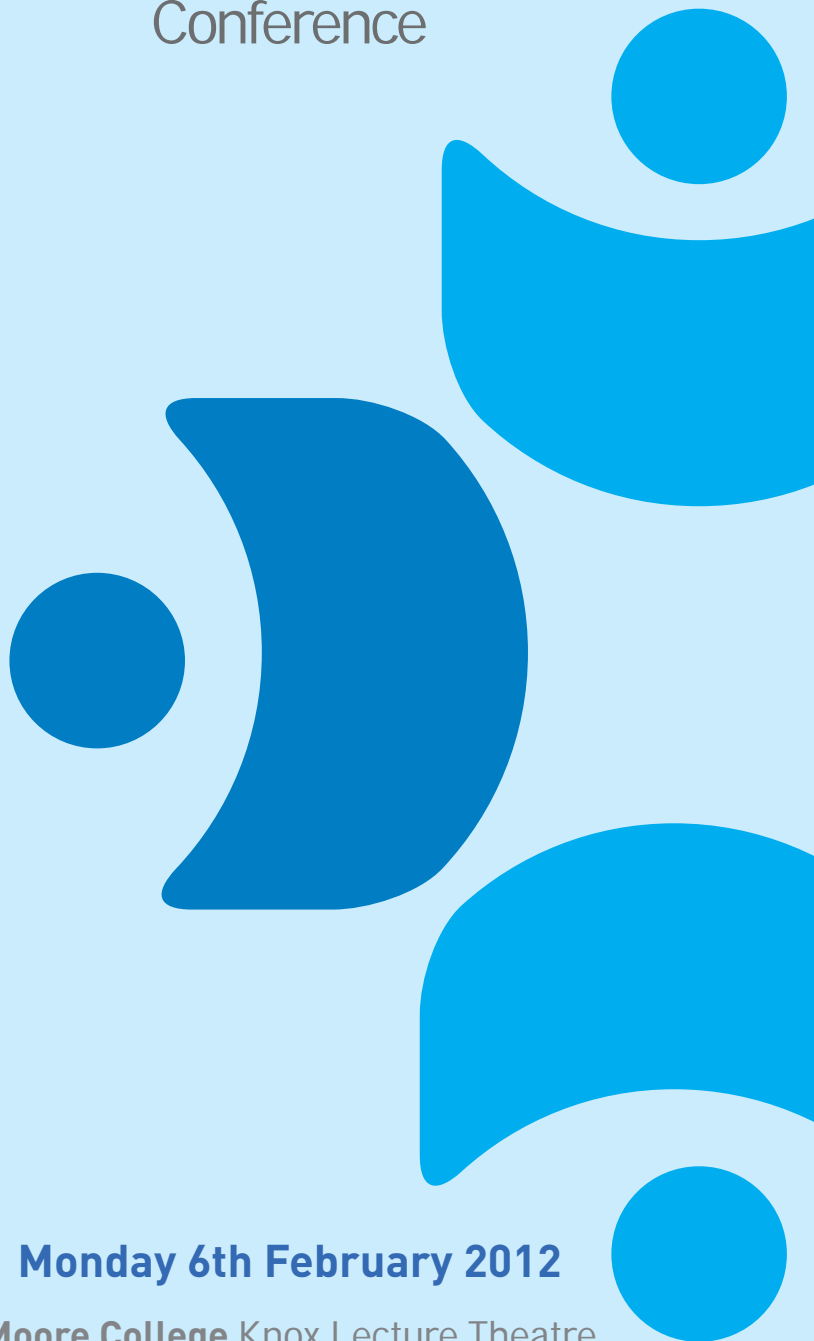

THE PRISCILLA AND AQUILA CENTRE

**A centre for the encouragement of the ministries
of women in partnership with men.**

The Centre has been named after Aquila and his wife Priscilla. Their story is fleetingly told in the pages of the New Testament. They were a remarkable couple whose labour for Christ left its mark on many lives. They were hospitable (Acts 18:2-3); they hosted churches in their homes (Rom 16:3-5; 1 Cor. 16:19); and they taught together (Acts 18:26-28). Priscilla and Aquila worked in partnership with Paul (Acts 18:18-19) and he considered them to be his "fellow workers in Christ Jesus" (Rom. 16:3). We don't know the details, but they risked their lives for him (Rom. 16:4). We do know that Paul and "all the churches of the Gentiles" gave thanks to God for them (Rom. 16:4). Paul also mentions them in his final letter, sending them greetings as faithful partners in the gospel when so many others had deserted Paul, and abandoned the faith (2 Tim 4:19). They were faithful to the end. Priscilla and Aquila are a wonderful example of faithful service together in the cause of Jesus Christ and their example can be applied in many ways as this Centre, named after them, seeks to think further about women and men together in ministry.
