Background

Did you know that Moore College began as the result of a gift in a will? When Thomas Moore passed away in 1840, he gifted a large portion of his estate to the establishment of a theological college in Sydney. As a result, Moore Theological College was opened in 1856 with three students and one tutor!

Gifts in wills continue to be a significant element in funding the ministry of the College. Recently, the John Chapman Preaching Clinics and Conferences initiative was set up based on a bequest from John Chapman. “Chappo” left his gift with the intention of training the next generation of Bible teachers in preaching.



Other gifts have enabled Bible courses to be translated into varied languages for training Christians with our partners around the world, even in prisons! As well, they’ve funded key tools to maximise students’ learning experiences at College like the library and IT. Bequests have also helped to build, renovate and maintain our buildings.

Suggested wording for your will

The suggested wording for gifts in wills follows. These words may be varied and made more specific depending on your wishes. Check the wording with the Moore College Partnerships team if in doubt. The College can also obtain legal advice for you if this is required.

%) percentage of my estate, to Moore Theological
College Council for the general purposes (or
specific purpose) of the college, and I declare that
the receipt of the treasurer of the College Council
shall be a full and sufficient discharge to the
executor.

*if the gift is of shares or real property or art work
then sufficient words to identify same should be
substituted.

Steps to preparing your will

As you consider making a gift in your will to Moore College, we’d like to offer the below points of guidance.

1. Prayerfully consider how you’d like to distribute your assets:

2. Prepare your will and seek legal advice to make it sure it will be binding:

Your will is a legal document and disputed wills are common. Therefore, we’d suggest you seek independent advice from a solicitor.
