



From the Principal...

2022 has been a year of turmoil and change. The war in Ukraine, the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II after 70 years on the throne, a change of government in Australia, the lingering disruption of COVID, economic upheaval and the pressure on day-to-day life — a very great deal has happened and it has disturbed many of us.

In times of such disturbance our great comfort remains God's unchanging character of grace, compassion and love. Book IV of the Psalms begins with Psalm 90, a prayer of Moses, the man of God. It is a reminder of God's faithfulness in the past, his power and majesty, his righteous judgment and terrifying wrath. But it is also an appeal to God's compassion, his unfailing love, his favour and his capacity to establish the work of our hands for us.

In the midst of these reminders, Moses prays another prayer: "Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom". There is a way of looking at life, even life in the shadow of sin's dreadful work and its consequences, that is wise. It is not a shallow Pollyanna-like blind optimism that does not see the pain of the moment. It is a recognition that hard times come from the hand of the Lord as well as good times, but they both find their source in God's unfailing love. Calling out to God, even asking hard questions of God as Moses does in this Psalm — Relent, Lord! How long will it be? — helps us to number our days in wisdom.

Prayer is such a remarkable gift of God to us. The invitation to open our hearts and not hold back as we address the Lord of heaven and earth, who is God from everlasting to everlasting, is astonishing grace. Your prayers for our College, for our students, for the work that goes on here and from here, and that we would remain faithful until the Lord returns, are also a generous expression of grace. Thank you. May the Lord continue to bless you over the Summer.
