FROM THE PRINCIPAL



I recently read a devotion on the opening words of the Lord's prayer which pointed out the wonder of the privilege we have in praying to 'Our Father in heaven'. The author pointed out that both parts of that phrase are critically important. The one to whom we pray is "our Father" and he is "in heaven".

There is an appropriate intimacy in Christian prayer. We have been invited to address the God of all the universe as Jesus did. He addressed God as Father, and in the Lord's prayer he invites us to do the same. The Spirit given to all who are Christ's enables us to call God Father (Rom. 8:15). We need not come to prayer with fear or uncertainty. We know the character of the one to whom we pray. In Jesus we see the overwhelming extent of his love. We do not come to God cautiously. God is our Father.

Yet there is an appropriate reverence in Christian prayer as well. Our Father is not simply a souped-up version of our best fathers. It is not just that our earthly fathers are all flawed and can never be perfect in love, wisdom and power as our heavenly Father is. He is our Father in heaven. He is the Creator of all things. He simply has to speak a word and the universe comes into existence. Before him all the earth trembles (Ps. 99:1; 114:7). When Jesus, the image of the invisible God, is seen for who he is, the appropriate response is to fall at his feet in worship (Luke 5:8; Phil. 2:10; Rev. 1:17). So we do not come to God casually. God is our Father in heaven.

In Jesus' own prayer life we see both his intimacy with his Father (Mark 14:36) but also his recognition that the living God is holy (John 17:11). These two things are not incompatible but mutually reinforcing.

Our recognition of God's tender love for those he has made gives us confidence, but it also gives us a fresh view of his glory and majesty. The cross and resurrection of Jesus is the most magnificent display of his power and victory over everything that opposes us. Similarly, our recognition that we are speaking to the God of the universe, who is so utterly above anything we could imagine in holiness, glory and power, gives us a fresh view of his love, mercy and grace. God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us (Rom. 5:8). He was raised from the dead so that we too might walk in newness of life (Rom. 6:4).

As you pray through this prayer bulletin over the next three months, I trust that you will be enriched by both these wonderful truths: "Our Father" and "in heaven". Thank you for praying.
