From the Principal...

Prayer Bulletin

The wonderful privilege of prayer should be a source of delight, but sometimes we find it so hard. Distractions easily intrude, the pressure of deadlines and jobs still to be done draws us away, and our own sinful independence can also get in the way. Though we know prayer is such a good thing, and though that becomes evident again to us when we pray, it is sometimes a battle to bring ourselves to pray.

I take it that, in some measure, this is why we have so many exhortations and encouragements to pray in the Scriptures. God knows very well the way we either feel stretched or else are tempted to think we are self-sufficient. Though we have this extraordinary privilege of bringing our cares and concerns before the God who made all things and demonstrated his love so undeniably in the cross of Jesus, we need to be urged to do it because left to ourselves we would not.

One such encouragement is Paul's words to the Philippians, 'Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God' (Phil. 4:6). It is instructive to notice how he puts concern, worry, anxiety, on one side and prayer on the other. Rather than being worried, pray. Rather than being worn down by the demands of the moment, pray. Rather than giving up because the task or tasks before you seem beyond you, pray.

We have the unutterable privilege of living for and speaking of the Saviour who at great cost has brought us from death to life. Yet both the living and the speaking can at times seem way beyond us. Paul's great response would be: pray.

As we make the most of the great privilege of prayer — and particularly as you pray for our College and the men and women preparing here to take the gospel to the world — will you delight in that privilege and not be weighed down by it? God himself has invited us to pray. God himself enables us to pray. And God himself has promised to hear us when we pray.

Thank you for your continued faithfulness in praying for the College.
