

From the Principal...

The first disciples learned to pray from their Master. They saw Jesus at prayer often. They heard him talk about prayer and encourage them to call upon the one true and living God as "our Father" (Matt 6:9). They watched him pray for the healing and blessing of others (John 11:41-42) and agonise in prayer over the cost of saving his people from their sins (Luke 22:39-46). And so from the start, they prayed.

It is recorded for us in the Book of Acts. The eleven went back to Jerusalem after the ascension and "all these with one accord were devoting themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of lesus, and his brothers" (Acts 1:14). They cast themselves upon God, not just as a one-off event but they were devoted; it was the pattern of their life together. When it dawns on them that there were always meant to be twelve apostles and without Judas there was a vacancy, their instinct was to pray: "You, Lord, who know the hearts of all, show which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place" (v 25).

The apostles knew that the ministry entrusted to them was something they could not prosecute alone. They saw what happened when that was attempted while Jesus was among them (Matt 17:19). If they were going to take his word to the ends of the earth until the end of the age, then they could not do it alone. As much as anything else, that is why, later in Acts they spoke of devoting themselves "to prayer and to the ministry of the word" (Acts 6:4). One goes with the other. One is impoverished without the other.

Thank you for praying for us here at Moore College. Thank you for so joining with us in partnership. We cannot do this alone. We certainly cannot do it in our own strength, physical or intellectual. We need our Lord to keep us faithful, to give us energy and wisdom, to raise up a new generation of gospel workers, and to ensure at every point what we do is directed and shaped by the word of God. Please keep praying and let us know how we can pray for you.

Week 3: Monday, 10 January - Sunday, 16 January


